

ANNEXE EU - SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR THE ccTLD .EU

In addition to the general terms and conditions CG-ND, the registration or use of a Domain Name in a .EU Extension implies the acceptance and respect of these special terms and conditions CP-ND-EU.

All terms employed in these special terms and conditions beginning with a capital letter are to be interpreted in compliance with the definition assigned to them in the general terms and conditions CG-ND.

CLAUSE EU.1: TRUSTEE AUTHORITY AND REGISTRY

EU.1.1 FranceDNS manages domain names through the registrar NETIM, his holding company who is officially accredited by the Registry. FranceDNS systems are linked to NETIM and the Registry so that all Operations are performed automatically with efficiency and security.

CLAUSE EU.2: REGISTRATION REGULATIONS

EU.2.1 Domain Names under this Extension are registered on a "*first come, first served*" basis

EU.2.2 The Client declares and guarantees that the Domain Name respects the rights of third-parties, currently applicable laws as well as the regulations specific to the Extension, which can be consulted at the following addresses:

The Client agrees to have read and accepted this contractual document (the "EURid Regulations" below) which links it to the EURid Registry. These special terms and conditions do not substitute these regulations which are integrated by means of a hyperlink.

CLAUSE EU.3: TRANSFER REGULATIONS

EU.3.1 The Client initiates through the intermediary of FranceDNS a transfer request for a Domain Name in .EU from another registration Agent to NETIM (also referred to as "incoming transfer"), according to the procedure specified on our site, and in compliance with EURID Regulations:

EU.3.2 The transfer does not take effect immediately. The Client must follow the described procedure and, particularly, must approve the transfer to the registry following a format specified on the Registry's Website.

EU.3.3 If the Client refuses or does not approve the transfer according to the terms stipulated by the Registry, the transfer cannot be proceeded with and the Client may not claim any compensation or refund from FranceDNS

SECTION EU.4: CHANGE of OWNERSHIP REGULATIONS

EU.4.1 The Client initiates, through the intermediary of FranceDNS, a request for a change of ownership for a Domain Name in .EU

EU.4.2 The change does not take effect immediately. The Client must follow the described procedure and, particularly, must approve the transfer to the registry following a format specified on the Registry's Website.

EU.4.3 If the Client refuses or does not approve the change of ownership according to the terms stipulated by the Registry, the change cannot be proceeded with and the Client may not claim any compensation or refund from FranceDNS

CLAUSE EU.5: EXPIRY / RESTORATION REGULATIONS

EU.5.1 When the Domain Name's expiry date has passed without prior renewal by the Client, FranceDNS shall submit a request for the deletion of the Domain Name to the Registry. The Domain Name shall then be disabled for a period of forty (40) calendar days during which all FranceDNS's associated services shall no longer be available. The Domain Name shall be referred to as in "quarantine" status

EU.5.2 If a Domain Name has been destroyed with the past forty (40) calendar days, it can be reactivated subject to the following conditions and procedures, and depending on the details provided to FranceDNS when carrying out these procedures:

- i) restoration is only possible from a technical point of view for the so-called "quarantine" period, which is the forty (40) day period between the destruction of the Domain Name by FranceDNS and its destruction by the Registry
- ii) payment for the restoration must be made seven (7) days before the destruction of the Domain Name by the Registry, to enable FranceDNS to carry out the operation within the time limit. Failing this, the Domain Name cannot be restored and FranceDNS cannot be held responsible on these grounds.
- iii) the restoration procedure restores the Domain Name's previous parameters (personal and technical information) and extends by one (1) year the duration of the Domain Name's registration starting from the previous expiry date.

CLAUSE EU.6: CONTRACTUAL AMENDMENTS FOR SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

EU.6.1 Regulation laid down by the Trustee Authority and the Registry are subject to change. These changes, linked to the naming system for .EU extension are imposed by EURid in charge of this Extension and represent changes that are not beyond FranceDNS's control.
