

## **ANNEX LU - SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR THE ccTLD .LU**

In addition to the general terms and conditions CG-ND, the registration or use of a Domain Name in a .LU Extension implies the acceptance and respect of these special terms and conditions CP-ND-LU.

All terms employed in these special terms and conditions beginning with a capital letter are to be interpreted in compliance with the definition assigned to them in the general terms and conditions CG-ND.

### **SECTION LU.1: TRUSTEE AUTHORITY AND REGISTRY**

LU.1.2 FranceDNS manages .LU domain names through the registrar NETIM, his holding company who is officially accredited by DNS Luxembourg. FranceDNS systems are linked to NETIM and the Registry so that all Operations are performed automatically with efficiency and security.

### **SECTION LU.2: REGISTRATION REGULATIONS**

LU.2.1 Domain Names under this Extension are registered on a "*first come, first served*" basis, unless if exception is made by the registry (i.e. for prohibited or reserved terms).

LU.2.2 The Client declares and guarantees that the Domain Name respects the rights of third-parties, currently applicable laws as well as the regulations specific to the Extension, which can be consulted at the following addresses:

The Client agrees to have read and accepted these contractual documents (the "DNSLU Regulations" below) which link him to the Registry. These special terms and conditions do not substitute these regulations which are integrated by means of a hyperlink.

### **SECTION LU.3: SPECIAL REQUIEREMENTS**

LU.3.1 Regarding DNSLU Regulations, the name servers (DNS) of the domain name must be correctly configured as specified in the Registry's technical specifications:

FranceDNS will send the registration to the registry only if the domain name passes the corresponding nameserver check.

### **SECTION LU.4: TRANSFER REGULATIONS**

LU.4.1 The Client initiates through the intermediary of FranceDNS a transfer request for a Domain Name in .LU from another registrar to NETIM (also referred to as "incoming transfer"), according to the procedure specified on our site, and in compliance with DNSLU Regulations:

LU.4.2 The incoming transfer does not take effect immediately. The Client must follow the described procedure and, particularly, must approve the transfer to the registry following a format specified.

LU.4.3 If the Client refuses or does not approve the transfer according to the terms stipulated by the Registry, the transfer cannot be proceeded with and the Client may not claim any compensation or refund from FranceDNS

## **SECTION LU.5: CHANGE of OWNERSHIP REGULATIONS**

LU.5.1 The Client initiates, through the intermediary of FranceDNS, a request for a change of ownership for a Domain Name in .LU

LU.5.2 The change does not take effect immediately. The Client must follow the described procedure and, particularly, must approve the transfer to the registry following a format specified on the Registry's Website.

LU.5.3 If the Client refuses or does not approve the change of ownership according to the terms stipulated by the Registry, the change cannot be proceeded with and the Client may not claim any compensation or refund from FranceDNS

## **SECTION LU.6: EXPIRY / RESTORATION REGULATIONS**

LU.6.1 When the Domain Name's expiry date has passed without prior renewal by the Client, FranceDNS shall submit a request for the deletion of the Domain Name to the Registry. The Domain Name shall then be disabled for a period of forty (40) calendar days during which all FranceDNS's associated services shall no longer be available. The Domain Name shall be referred to as in "quarantine" status

LU.6.2 If a Domain Name has been destroyed within the past forty (40) calendar days, it can be reactivated subject to the following conditions and procedures, and depending on the details provided to FranceDNS when carrying out these procedures:

- i) restoration is only possible from a technical point of view for the so-called "quarantine" period, which is the forty (40) day period between the destruction of the Domain Name by FranceDNS and its destruction by the Registry
- ii) payment for the restoration must be made seven (7) days before the destruction of the Domain Name by the Registry, to enable FranceDNS to carry out the operation within the time limit. Failing this, the Domain Name might not be restored and FranceDNS cannot be held responsible on these grounds.
- iii) the restoration procedure restores the Domain Name's previous parameters (personal and technical information) and extends by one (1) year the duration of the Domain Name's registration starting from the previous expiry date.

## **SECTION LU.7: CONTRACTUAL AMENDMENTS FOR SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

LU.7.1 Regulation laid down by the Trustee Authority and the Registry are subject to change. These changes, linked to the naming system for .LU extensions are imposed by the Registry in charge of this Extension and represent changes that are not beyond FranceDNS's control.
